Earl Hoffman's Vision told by his wife, Audrey Hoffman

On November 28, 2012, at Bronson Hospital in Minnesota, Earl was told in such a loving way by a lady doctor who got down on her knees and put her hands on his knees that he had two or maybe three months to live. His face went white. We came home and the next evening around 6 pm the family came in, about ten or more people. They woke Earl from a nap and wheeled him into the kitchen. He didn't want to eat. He had his eyes closed and his head bowed this whole time.

All of a sudden he said, "*Beautiful.*"

He sat there a minute and he said, "*Beautiful*" again.

Then he had tears rolling down his face. I went by him and I said, "*What is it honey?*"

He never raised his head. With his eyes closed, he said, "*I see my mother and my dad.*" (They are both deceased.) He said, "*I see a river and a bridge over it and I am walking on the bridge.*"

He was silent for a minute, eyes always closed, head bowed. Then he had the most handsome smile cross his face. Then he said, "*I see Jesus and He touched me on my head.*" He was so elated (I would say that was the word for it) because he joyfully said, "*I'm going home.*"

He put his hand out, and he said "*I'm going home, Paul, shake my hand.*" Paul shook his hand.
